SUMMARY OF CLINICAL PRACTICE

I have been a supra-regional urological specialist for both open and endoscopic renal (kidney) surgery for many years, with a particular interest in stone disease. I have an international reputation in this area.

I am a member of the British Association of Urological Surgeons, Uro-oncology Section, and have been Chairman of North London Cancer Network Committee (urology), which was responsible for the governance and outcome of all urological tumour surgery in the region. I have extensive experience of both renal and bladder cancer surgery, and worked for a number of years at the Regional Cancer Centre at University College Hospital, as well as the Royal Free Hospital while at the same time being the lead clinician at The Whittington Hospital.

I am completely conversant with the medical and endoscopic techniques for the treatment of prostate disease.

I am an internationally recognised authority in urological day surgery with emphasis on minimally invasive methods. Most scroto-genital surgery can be performed as a day case (circumcision, vasectomy, vasectomy reversal, epididymal cysts, varicocoeles, and testicle removal).

I have 25 years' experience dealing with the major surgical complications following gynecological surgery (perforated bladder, fistulae, ureteric damage) I was lead clinician in this respect serving a very busy Obs and Gynae Unit.

For 25 years I was responsible for the urological management of the complications associated with our Spinal Unit and Neurological Department at The Whittington NHS Trust.

In the last 10 years I have become interested in Urological Pain Syndromes (painful bladder syndrome, urethral syndrome, prostatitis, pelvic pain of a urological origin, chronic testicular pain). I have developed a number of novel treatments for these difficult conditions with a good degree of success.

My clinical work is supported by considerable experience of research, which has resulted in more than 250 publications and over 270 national and international presentations. I was also responsible for eight post-graduate degrees from my department, which were both sponsored and supervised from the Whittington Urology Department by myself.

I no longer work within the National Health Service, having resigned as Head of Department at The Whittington Hospital in 2012. I am currently endeavouring to

provide a more personalized service in the private hospitals where I work. I continue my close academic links with university departments for teaching and research. I hold the position of Honorary Senior Lecturer (Institute of Urology) and regularly lecture at national meetings on clinical and medico-legal issues. I attend regular MDTs at the London Clinic.

I have completed regular appraisals since 2004 and continue to do so.

SUMMARY OF MEDICO-LEGAL PRACTICE

I have specialist medico-legal knowledge in gynaecological injury to the urinary tract, bladder overdistention, stone disease, cauda equina and cancer cases. I am also able to report on general urology: torsion, vasectomy, prostate surgery and pelvic fractures. I am happy to consider the merits of a case based upon a short summary letter and provide full costings in advance of work being undertaken.

I have an extensive medico-legal practice with 30 years' experience at consultant level. I have produced several thousand reports. I do approximately 100 new cases a year. These are divided into 20% defendant, 70% claimant and 10% single joint expert. These cases are either negligence or major injury cases.

I have attended six courses on preparation of medical legal reports. I have also attended a courses on court presentations, as well as many meetings on medicolegal issues.

I have lectured on preparation of medico-legal reports and legal issues (RSM, Holyrood Urological Society and French Urological Update Course, BMA, MPS, BAUS, LCA, Patient Safety Association as well as invited hospital talks and Aspen Group).

I have participated in the Inner Temple Further Education Day for Barristers (Advocacy training for Barristers). I am medico-legal advisor to the London Clinic MDT.

I have lectured on the Gough Square Clinical and Legal Update Seminar. I have received instructions from most of the leading law firms dealing with medical legal issues as well as the NHS litigation authority and ISCAS. I receive regular instructions from leading Irish Solicitors, the MDU and MPS and have attended GMC Hearings as an expert.

I am a member of the Medico-legal section of the RSM. I am validated on The UK Expert Witness Register. I am also validated by The Academy of Experts and The Association of Forensic and Expert Witnesses. I am a BAUS approved and trained medico-legal expert. I was voted Expert Witness of the Year 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021 by Lawyers Monthly. I am also validated by The Academy of Experts. I have completed the training for mediation (2021)

SUMMARY OF TEACHING

My three previous academic appointments as Lecturer (anatomy), Senior Lecturer (Institute of Urology) and Postgraduate Dean (Royal Northern Hospital) have

allowed me to develop the necessary skills to teach and organise both undergraduate and postgraduate medical students. As Clinic Tutor (Dean) at the Royal Northern Hospital, I gained experience in educational committee work at regional level. I have had the opportunity to examine in the MB examination on two occasions and have examined regularly for the Institute of Urology in the Post Graduate Diploma of Urology. In 2003 I became Hon Senior Lecturer at the Royal Free Hospital. In 2005 I was appointed as Hon Consultant Senior Lecturer UCH.

I was responsible for the first 'hands on' teaching courses in European urology (Percutaneous Surgery in 1982) and have subsequently run many courses on minimally invasive surgery, sedoanalgesia, prostatic laser surgery and day surgery at the Institute, The Royal Society of Medicine, The British Association of Urological Surgeons and the Whittington Hospital itself. I have joined the teaching faculty on similar courses in America, Germany, Holland, Belgium, France and Italy. These events have been commercially successful, sponsorship and fees making a contribution of \pounds 200,000 to my research funds at the Whittington over a 23-year period. I am was college tutor in Endourology at the Royal College of Surgeons.

I have organised three successful World congresses in Percutaneous Renal Surgery, the Second World Congress in Extracorporeal Shockwave Lithotripsy and The First Congress in AIDS in Surgery. I am fortunate to be able to lecture in German, French and Dutch. I have chaired and participated in scientific meetings throughout Europe and the USA.

As chairman of Medical.co.uk, a medical internet company, I was involved with the successful set up of one of the first internet medical information companies, which was responsible for syndicating very high quality medical data, which was subsequently sold to V Life Ltd.

I continue to teach GPs, colleagues and lawyers.

SUMMARY OF MANAGEMENT EXPERIENCE

In 1989 I became Head of the Department at the Whittington Hospital and thus responsible for running and organising the Department of Urology. My commercial and international connections have proved useful in placing additional equipment and funding to the department.

Outside medicine I have held directorships in numerous companies: Miller of Golden Square, Woolaston House Ltd., Johnstead Properties, Ronaldstead Properties, BDI Publishing and Endotek Ltd. As treasurer of the Society of Minimally Invasive Therapy, I have had a good insight into charitable institutions, corporate organisations and accounts. I was Chairman of Medical.co.uk, an internet company (1999-2000), which was successfully sold to V-Life, a French Company. I was Managing Director and Senior Partner of Woolaston House Private Medical Chambers. The Chambers were successfully sold in 2008.

In 2006 I became Chairman of the North London Cancer Network Urology Tumour Board. I have been responsible for centralizing services, designating Cancer Surgeons ensuring quality and designing "Hub and Spoke" arrangements. I am currently MD of Urology Chambers Limited. I remain a Senior Partner to Woolaston House PMC and advisor to the company. I was Consultant Urological Advisor to The Centre Of Health and Human Performance.

RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT AND ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

My research work undertaken since 1975 has culminated in the publication of 147 papers, 21 case reports, 250 abstracts, 2 textbooks, 2 journal supplements, 27 textbook chapters, more than over 270 international and national presentations using all aspects of presentation including formal lectures, posters, videos and teleconferencing.

My publications have dealt with developments in endoscopes and high technology accessories as well as new minimally invasive clinical innovations. In 1986, I was awarded the Mastership of Surgery by the University of London for my work on Percutaneous Nephrolithotomy, the first United Kingdom thesis dealing exclusively with minimally invasive surgery. I was fortunate to be honoured by the Royal College of Surgeons with a Hunterian oration and professorship on the same subject that year. Further publications relate to cancer cell biology, urinary tract infection and neuro-pharmocology and legal issues.

My expertise in these areas has been recognised by my appointment to the British Association of Urological Surgeons Instrument Committee and my position on the Council of the Biological Engineering Council. I was joint winner of the Royal College of Surgeons Cutler's prize for best surgical instrument in 1983. Μv pioneering work on low trauma, low profile endoscopes, injectable local anaesthesia, bladder sensation and reversible sedation has resulted in the now internationally recognised technique of Sedoanalgesia. The clinical use of this method has resulted in improved safety, increased day case rates and reduced costs. I have an excellent working relationship with specialist departments in: The Cavendish Laboratories in Cambridge, Imperial College of Science and Technology, Cranfield Institute of Technology, The National Physical Laboratories, University College of London and the Magnetic Spectroscopy Unit at Oxford. have also worked closely with Karl Storz GMBH, Richard Wolf GMBH, ACMI, GU Manufacturing, Bard, Hoffman La Roche, Fresenius, Schering Plough, Synthalabo, ICI and the government research institution at Porton Down via my connections with the Ministry of Defence.

I formed a ten year working relationship with Professor David Phillips at the CRI. This allowed for two clinical fellows to pursue MD Projects in cancer cell biology. These were completed in 2006 and 2007.

In addition, I set up a joint working relationship with Professor Claire Fowler at the Hospital for Nervous Diseases and Prof. Malone Lee at The Whittington Hospital. This involved the study of Botox B to prevent bladder over activity in unstable and MS patients. The aim here is to obviate the need for reconstructive cystoplasty, which seems to be a realistic goal. The results were conclusive an MD has been submitted 2006 and approved 2007.

I have funded and supervised two projects for higher degrees (Mchir Sedoanalgesia, MS flow mechanics). I have jointly funded and supervised a further MS on lasers with my colleague Graham Watson. I have supervised and funded a PhD project on extracorporeal electromagnetic ureteric peristalsis. There are 2 further MD projects were completed in 2006 and 2007 in Prostate Cell Biology. 1 MD was awarded in 2007 in Neurobiology.

I have held the post of Consulting Editor to the Journal of Minimally Invasive Therapy, Journal of Endourology, Journal of Day Case Surgery and the Journal of Ambulatory Surgery. I have reviewed articles for the Annals of the College of Surgeons, the British Postgraduate Medical Journal, British Journal of Surgery and the Journal of Sexual Health. I am fortunate to have been a Council Member of the Section of Urology at the Royal Society of Medicine. I was a Royal College of Surgeon Tutor in Endourology.

I continue to lecture to GPs, colleagues embracing medico-legal issues as well as clinical topics.
